





Development Issue 1-2  Support for the Promotion of Infrastructure Development	[background and current situation] The shortage of public infrastructure, resulting from the recent economic growth and the emergence of the black middle-class, is recognised as a constraining factor for future economic growth. The South African government plans to make a large expansion of investments in infrastructure (investment of a total of about JPY 32 trillion in areas such as water, railways and electricity between 2012 and 2020), in parallel with infrastructure development in water sector and a design of master plan in electricity.			[Strategy] Japan will make available technical assistance on budget allocation and implimentation of projects by the government and public institutions, and support infrastructure project formulation through private sector investment. Japan will also continue to coordinate with the government and public institutions for formulating future loan projects.
