
Japanese Language Course 2013

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Introduction

This course introduces the basics of Japanese language and culture focusing on the practical use of the language and cultural awareness. Students will learn Hiragana and Katakana (Japanese characters) for writing and reading and will develop basic communication skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. They will also learn approximately 30 Kanjis (Chinese characters).

Both traditional and contemporary Japanese culture and society through various materials (videos, quizzes etc.) and activities (Origami, wearing Yukata etc.) will also be introduced. This course requires good study habits and class participation.
