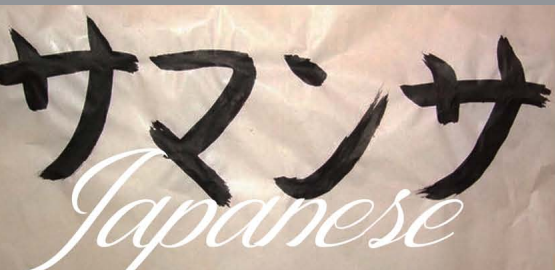




## Japanese Language Course- Part 1

3 March – 25 August 2015 - Course Fee: R5 300 per delegate (Vat inclusive)



### Introduction

This course introduces the basics of Japanese language and culture focusing on the practical use of the language and cultural awareness. Students will learn Hiragana and Katakana (Japanese characters) for writing and reading and will develop basic communication skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. They will also learn approximately 30 Kanjis (Chinese characters).

Various material and activities such as Origami and wearing Yukata will be used in exposing students to both traditional and contemporary Japanese culture and society.

For optimal benefit, the course requires good study habits and enthusiastic class participation from students.
