





The Government of Japan provides grant assistance to Qhomane High school in the Kingdom of Lesotho

On 13 March 2024, the Embassy of Japan in the Republic of South Africa signed a grant contract with Principal of Qhomane Lesotho Evangelical Church in Southern Africa High School (Qhomane High School) in Maseru, the Kingdom of Lesotho Lesotho, to implement The Grant Assistance for the Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP). Project details are as follows:

Recipient organisation's name: Qhomane Lesotho Evangelical Church in Southern Africa High School

Project title: The Project for the Construction of Classrooms for a High School in Qhomane, Maseru (USD 52,624)

The project aims to solve the shortage of classrooms and improve the poor learning environment with overcrowded capacity per class by constructing a new classroom building at Qhomane High School (about 480 students in total).

GGP is a Japanese funding scheme that was started in 1989. It assists non-profit organisations with a direct impact on the well-being of people at grassroots level. It gives priority to areas that aim to improve basic human needs, as well as areas of particular importance from the perspective of human security.

The Embassy of Japan hopes this support will help to achieve social and economic well-being for the people of the Kingdom of Lesotho.
