

The Government of Japan provides grant assistance to St. Barnabas High school in the Kingdom of Lesotho

On 10 March 2025, Embassy of Japan in the Kingdom of Lesotho (The Embassy of Japan in the Republic of South Africa is accredited to the Kingdom of Lesotho) signed a grant contract with Principal of St. Barnabas High School in Maseru, the Kingdom of Lesotho, to implement The Grant Assistance for the Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP). Project details are as follows:

Recipient organisation's name: St. Barnabas High School Project title: The Project for the Construction of Classrooms for St. Barnabas High School in Maseru (USD 69,736)

The aim of this project is to improve the educational environment of the school by constructing a new classroom building and providing school furniture (student desks, teacher's desks, teacher's chairs, blackboards), thereby contributing to the promotion of higher education in the region.

GGP is a Japanese funding scheme that was started in 1989. It assists nonprofit organisations with a direct impact on the well-being of people at grassroots level. It gives priority to areas that aim to improve basic human needs, as well as areas of particular importance from the perspective of human security.
