



The Government of Japan provides grant assistance to Mhlumeni High School in the Kingdom of Eswatini

On 6 March 2025, the Embassy of Japan in the Kingdom of Eswatini (The Embassy of Japan in the Republic of South Africa is accredited to the Kingdom of Eswatini) signed a grant contract with the principal of Mhlumeni High School in Siteki City, the Kingdom of Eswatini, to implement Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP). The project details are as follows:

Recipient organisation's name: Mhlumeni High School

Project title: The Project for the Construction of an Agricultural Lab for Mhlumeni High School in Siteki City (USD69,240)

The aim of this project is to enhance the environment for acquiring agricultural skills by establishing an agricultural lab (rearing rooms for indigenous, layer and broiler chickens, and rabbits; a storage room; a staffroom; a kitchen; and a laboratory), thereby contributing to the improvement of the employment rate of the school's students.

GGP is a Japanese funding scheme that was started in 1989. It assists non-profit organisations with a direct impact on the well-being of people at grassroots level. It gives priority to areas that aim to improve basic human needs, as well as areas of particular importance from the perspective of human security.

The Embassy of Japan hopes this support will help to achieve social and economic well-being for the people of the Kingdom of Eswatini.
